	<i>paper and pencil</i>	<i>draw fossil so they know its location in the rock</i>
	<i>drill</i>	<i>separate fossil from larger rocks</i>
	<i>pickax and chisel</i>	<i>separate fossil from larger rocks</i>
	<i>toothbrush</i>	<i>remove rock and dust bits</i>
Tool Picture	Tools Used to Study	How Tool Is Used
	<i>plaster-soaked strips</i>	<i>move fossil safely to the lab</i>
	<i>pliers and saws</i>	<i>remove plaster</i>
	<i>tiny jackhammer</i>	<i>clean grit away</i>
	<i>microscope</i>	<i>view tiny fossils</i>
	<i>glue</i>	<i>stick together broken pieces</i>
