FishBowl Socratic Seminar

Inner and Outer Circle Responsibilities

Fishbowl Directions:

- 1. A Fishbowl Socratic Seminar requires students to be divided into inner and outer circles.
- 2. Each round will have two parts, a part A and a part B.
- 3. During part A of the round, the inner circle will discuss and the outer circle will listen and take notes.
- 4. During part B of the round, the outer circle will share, ask questions, and provide insights to what they heard during part A.
- 5. After both circles have shared, the two groups of students switch roles and another round begins.

INNER-CIRCLE RESPONSIBILITIES:

You will engage in the discussion directly, and you will run the conversation almost entirely on your own.

- 1. Do not raise your hand. You may speak at any time.
- 2. If more than one person starts to speak at the same time, one should pause and allow the other to speak first; then the second student will speak next before any other members of the group chime in.
- 3. Be sure to be respectful and allow others to speak. Disagree directly, but politely with each other.
- 5. Ask each other questions.
- 6. Answer the questions and include examples and evidence from the text.

OUTER-CIRCLE RESPONSIBILITIES:

Your job is to listen to the discussion and take notes.

1. Note things you feel should have been addressed by the inner circle discussion.

- 2. Note questions you have that didn't get answered.
- 3. Note points that you need clarified by inner circle members.
- 4. Note textual evidence that could further support discussion.
- 5. You may not speak at all in part A. You will be asked to share your notes during part B of the round.
- 6. Be sure that you are taking adequate notes to be a part of the conversation.
